The one bright color on the shell torn fields and hills of these war-torn areas was the little, red poppy. On the edges of the trenches, in the ragged shell holes, brave little poppies grew and bloomed on the graves of

May's showers have nothing to do with these flowers

those men buried in the sacred plots of French soil, which was Flanders Field. Remembrances of the cheery bright red flowers returned to America with our boys. And so, the poppy became the symbol of the dead, their memorial flower. It became the sign that the high ideals for which these brave young men gave their lives, still live, and are honored.

This little red fabric flower, was created to honor those killed in World War I was made the official memorial flower of The American Legion in 1920 and The American Legion Auxiliary in 1921. The poppy program was made one of our national programs in 1924.

Today, the Legion's poppies are made by disabled veterans all winter in order for them to be distributed each May. Poppy distribution is still going strong. Last year, throughout the United States nearly ^{\$2}million was collected from poppy distribution and allocated to disabled or hospitalized veterans.

Volunteers with the American Legion each year sell these little red fabric poppies at local businesses and street corners. There is no required donation; everyone is asked to give whatever they are able. The annual fundraiser supplies money to Illinois Department of Veterans Affairs Homes. Money also goes to the Ladies Auxiliary to help local veterans.

Remember by wearing a Poppy!

That we can go months at a time and sometimes even a whole year without any new changes to our Veterans Administration benefits. Then suddenly we get a spurt of changes and/or new laws. Recently there have been three which I want to advise you on and ask your help in particular with the last one.

BRONZE MEDALLION

Most of us know by now that when we pass away we are entitled to a free government headstone. Many veterans, for various reasons, are interred in a private cemetery. It could be for religious reasons, to be close to a deceased spouse or family plot or for the shorter distance to visit the grave. Often times a headstone is purchased privately and there is no indication on those stones that a veteran occupies the grave. Until recently the Veterans Administration would furnish a Bronze Medallion to mark the grave BUT the veteran's death had to be after October 31, 1990. That law was changed and now any veteran who died since World War I can get this Medallion which can be placed on the private headstone. All branches of service are recognized and the sizes range from $2^{"} \times 1 1/2"$ to $6 3/8" \times 4 3/4"/$ The proper form to request this is 40-1330M and can be obtained by calling the National Call Center (1-800-827-1000) of the Veterans Administration. And by the way, this change was a direct result of one of our resolutions that was submitted by a Post in the 1st Division. It was passed at our State Convention and went on to our National Convention where it was also passed and became part of our legislative agenda!

PRE-NEED DETERMINATION FOR BURIAL IN A NATIONAL CEMETERY

Prior to this change, a veteran's family had to wait until the veteran passed away to determine eligibility for burial. Often times discharge papers were missing or misplaced and veterans ended up being buried in a private cemetery. Now a veteran can apply for eligibility ahead of time. After the proper form is processed the Veterans Administration cemetery system will keep a permanent record of eligibility. Upon a veterans death the Funeral Director need only call the Veterans Administration cemetery and furnish the Social Security number. You can also apply for pre-approval for your spouse. Once I heard of this law change I applied for both myself and my spouse. We are now on file! And remember, even if pre-approved you or your family can always change their mind and be buried privately. The correct form number is 40-10007 and can also be obtained at the above telephone number.

CAMP LEJEUNE DISABILITY PRESUMPTIVES

The regulations are now in place. If you served at Camp Lejeune for a minimum (cumulative) of 30 days between August 1, 1953 and December 31, 1986 you may now qualify for possible Veterans Administration service-connected compensation. This includes Reserve and National Guard members. The following conditions have been approved:

* Adult leukemia	* Bladder cancer
* Parkinson's disease	* Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma
* Kidney cancer	* Liver cancer
*Aplastic anemia and other myelodysplastic syndromes	* Multiple myeloma

This last one we can use your help. If you know of a veteran who meets the above requirements but died and left a widow or widower, that surviving spouse may qualify. Please have them contact our office as-soon-as-possible!

ATTENTION ALL POSTS

Important Notice

The American Legion is a strong supporter of the protection of the American Flag. The American Legion realizes there are proper platforms for expressing protest or disagreements. We vehemently reject using disrespect to the Flag of our Nation or the National Anthem as a way of protesting. The National Executive Committee passed the enclosed resolution addressing the issue for participants in our Youth programs.

Illinois strongly supports the action of The National Executive Committee. This means that local Posts will need to screen all participants in Boys State, Youth Police School, Oratorical Contest, American Legion Baseball or other programs to ensure compliance. Please take the time during the screening process to eliminate the embarrassment latter.

We support an individual's right to protest, but using our programs as a platform for that protest will not be allowed. Please ensure that whoever screens applications for participation in our Youth programs is aware of this new policy.

WHEREAS,	The American Legion realizes there are proper platforms for expressing protest or disagreement; and
WHEREAS,	The American Legion vehemently rejects using disrespect to the Flag of the United States or the National Anthem as a
	platform for publicly expressing protest or disagreement; now, therefore, be it
RESOLVED,	By the National Executive Committee of The American Legion in regular meeting assembled in Indianapolis,
	Indiana, on October 12-13, 2016, That The American Legion expects participants of all its programs to show proper
	respect to the Flag of the United States, at all times, including during the National Anthem; and, be it further
RESOLVED,	That the national organization of The American Legion recommends to departments and posts that the chairman or
	director of any American Legion program make clear to all participants in advance of the program that The
	American Legion has the expectation for rendering proper respect to the Flag of the United States, at all times,
	including during the National Anthem; and, be it further
RESOLVED,	That if any participant of any program of The American Legion cannot or will not live up to this expectation, the individual should not be a participant in American Legion programs; and, be it finally
RESOLVED.	That if any participant of any national-level program of The American Legion cannot or will not live up to this
,	

expectation, the individual will be removed from the program and not be allowed any further participation.

Someplace That You Should Know

Back in 2014, Mary Carmody saw that there was critical need to support the nearly 4,000 at-risk Veterans that currently reside in Lake County and personally created the Midwest Veterans Closet, where Veterans shop free!

It is located just a few blocks north of the Captain James A. Lovell Federal Health Center and just west of the Naval Station Great Lakes Recruit Training Command in North Chicago. The Midwest Veterans Closet occupies some 2,500 Square Feet where Mary together with two unpaid volunteers' provides services to a customer base that includes Active Military, Veterans and their families. In addition, they also support Building 66 a time limited residential rehabilitation treatment program for homeless veterans, PTSD and the Greenhouse Hospice wards at the FHCC. Any of the Patients at the FHCC may visit the location utilizing a free shuttle.

Although it is called a Veterans Closet and is making available new and gently used clothing for men, women and children for all seasons, it is not just about clothing! There is a food pantry, provides household goods and products, beds and bedding, children's toys, games, puzzles, an array of books available at all times. From time to time, there may be enough furniture to outfit entire apartments, pots and pans, and appliances too for Homeless Veterans getting back on their feet. As you can see, they are expanding their services to meet their customer needs. At the present time, they are serving some 400 Veterans which accounts for nearly \$130,000 in goods provided per month.

One of the new areas that Mary has created is the "Drop In Center" where Veterans can stop in and may need to use one of several computers, they can write letters and resumes, access their VA benefits or search for jobs. Maybe just watch TV, share a lunch or just reminisce with a fellow veteran. In the past, they have helped put together some of the Poppies that are used in and around the state.

State Farm Insurance has a program "Suits for Sailors", which they donated 400 new suits that are being used by Military personnel going out into the civilian world and might need a suit for their interviews or job fairs. The Closet regularly receives men and women's professional clothing donations and has created a Professional Section for any Veteran that might need this type of clothing.

The Midwest Veteran's Closet operates entirely through donations from individual, local towns, veteran's assistance commissions and veteran's service organizations. This in turn enables them to make a Huge Impact to support our Veterans, their families and all of financial assistance received, goes directly to provide these much needed services.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS ILLINOIS STATE GAMES AT ISU NORMAL, ILLINOIS JUNE 9 & 10, 2017






