That as Chairman of the 1st Division VA&R committee I am required to make a report each year to that Division. I thought it would be informative to our members who live outside the 1st Division to see what we have accomplished up north.

It has been a pleasure and honor to serve the First Division as your representative on the VA&R Commission for the 2016-2017 year as well as one of the two Divisions service officers. I attended two VA&R meetings which were held at our Bloomington headquarters as well as the Washington D.C. conference. VA benefit law changes continue and every effort was made to get this info to the Division level. This was done by way of my monthly articles in the Department and Division newsletters, oral presentations before the Division meetings and having handouts available at the meetings. I also hosted 9 Power Point presentations at local posts, senior centers, local libraries and several VA hospitals. These presentations covered the entire spectrum of VA benefits from headstones to home loans and pensions to hospital care. I hope to do more of these in the fall if appointed to this position again.

The 1st Division will have 8 resolutions submitted to our Department convention. One that was submitted last year regarding the Veterans Administration Bronze Medallion for marking private headstones was accepted and Congress passed Public Law 114-315. Veterans who died prior to 1990 and purchased their own headstone can now have the family order this Medallion.

I have been the editor of a monthly article in the Department newsletter entitled "Did You Know" and have received many favorable comments. You can view these articles (back two years) on the Department web site www.illegion.org. Feel free to copy and paste these articles into your district or post newsletters. Just give credit to Department if you do. I have also cohosted a monthly BINGO game at VA Jesse Brown hospital. Post 183, 777 and 806 were cosponsors. These games are held at 2:00 on the first Monday of the month. Veteran patients come down from the wards and outpatient clinics to play. We average 30--40 veterans per game and \$200+ is given out in prizes and raffle gifts each month. Donations for this are welcome.

The VA&R Director of the Chicago office, Wayne Macejak, was able to get some funding from Department and that office is now better staffed but we have had many personnel changes. We lost Carolina Contreras when she accepted a better job offer. She was replaced by our own former 9th District Commander, Al Pizarro who is fluent in Spanish. He served in the Army and was stationed in Germany. Terry James also left the office for a better job and there are no current plans to replace him. There are no current walk-in hours but veterans may call to make an appointment. Telephone hours are Monday through Friday from 8:00 to 4:00 with 24/7 voicemail after that.

Recent Concerns on Flag Disposal

The Department is receiving questions of concern from Legionnaires about disposal of the American Flags. The flags made of nylon or polyester materials, are the big concern. Some Legion Posts have been taking these flags to funeral homes that do cremation. But now the funeral homes do not want to take them because the flags melt and when they burn the fumes from these flags are toxic.

A call was made to American Legion National Headquarters asking for suggestions on what to do with these types of flags for proper disposal?

Nationals Answer: To be honest with you, this is an issue that offers no simple clear-cut solution.

In 1989 Congress agreed that term "flag of the United States" means any flag of the United States, or any part thereof, made of any substance, of any size, in a form commonly displayed. Hence when a flag is no longer a fitting emblem for display (regardless of

the material it is made of) it is to be disposed of, preferably by burning.

The vast majority of United States flags displayed today are made of nylon or polyester materials, and are inherently difficult to dispose of by burning. Governmental agencies such as the Environmental Protection Agency do have their legitimate concerns when it comes to the burning of these unserviceable flags because of the harmful and hazardous gasses emitted.

One solution is: You might want to contact a trash disposal service that has an incinerator that can burn these flags at a very high temperature.

There is also a nylon recycling process, American Flag Recycling(www.americanflagdisposal.com/flag_recycling.html) which converts virtually one hundred percent of a nylon flag back into virgin grade nylon material, which can be used to manufacture new nylon flags.

Please be advised that The American Legion does not endorse this service, we simply offer it as a possible disposal resource.

We wish we could offer you more solutions.

Illinois Legion leadership to support 20-mile veteran march



The fourth annual Chicago Veterans: Ruck March is May 26, and members of The American Legion Department of Illinois will be volunteering to show their support.

More than 1,500 veterans, their families and military supporters are expected to participate in the event, which raises awareness for PTSD and veteran suicide. Participants will wear a 20-

pound ruck sack and walk 20 miles through the streets of Chicago to represent the number of veteran suicides daily, and to honor and remember servicemembers lost at home and on the battlefield.

The event starts at Veterans Memorial Park in Glencoe at 8 a.m. with lunch at Centennial Memorial Park in Evanston. Legionnaires will have a tent at the lunch stop to pass out bananas, water and poppies in honor of the Legion's National Poppy Day on May 26, as well as have a service officer on hand to answer questions and information on Legion membership and other available veteran resources.

Department of Illinois leadership who will be in attendance includes Past National Commander and Department Adjutant Marty Conatser, Asst. Adjutant Gary Jensen and Membership Director Chad Woodburn.



Also helping was VA & R Director and Service Officer Wayne Macejak and Past First Division Commander Derrick Stinson.

The event is organized by Chicago Veterans, a non-profit launched by Legionnaire Kevin Barszcz that "empowers veterans to take control of their transition throughout life." Learn more at www.chicagovets.org.

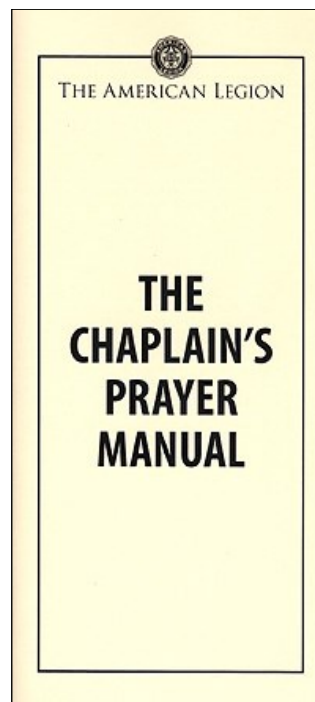

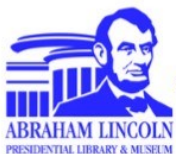

COME JOIN US TO HELP CELEBRATE "MOTHER" BICKERDYKE'S 200TH BIRTHDAY

MARY ANN "MOTHER" BICKERDYKE TO BE HONORED ON 200TH BIRTHDAY 2017 is the year to honor Mary Ann "Mother" Bickerdyke for her life of looking after the "Boys in Blue" both during and after the American Civil War. On July 19, 2017 at 5:00 pm, there will be a free Ice Cream Social in Standish park honoring "Mother's" 200th birthday.

Additionally, over the summer, banners commemorating her birthday will be hung on the Bickerdyke Bridge and in two blocks on Main Street in downtown Galesburg. In addition to the free Ice Cream Social, there will be a free showing of the movie "Glory" in the Sanderson Room at the Galesburg Public Library on July 15, 2017 at 1:00 pm. Pam Johnson will recreate her role as Mother Bickerdyke at 4:00 pm on July 19th in the Sanderson Room at the Library.

In the fall of 1861, Mary Ann Bickerdyke, a widow, was sent by the congregation from the Brick Church in Galesburg, with \$500 in supplies to protect the health and welfare of the Illinois soldiers. Once there, Bickerdyke's influence on military triage care began transforming the way medical care was delivered to wounded soldiers. The men referred to her as the "Cyclone in calico" and called this amazing and heroic woman "Mother". With her busy hands and open heart, she took charge scrubbing and cleaning everything in sight calling these men "her precious boys".

She set up and ran 300 hospitals on 19 battlefields. She was the Chief of Nursing under General Ulysses S. Grant and General William Sherman. She was described as a determined nurse who did not let anyone stand in the way of her duties. When a surgeon questioned her authority to take some action, she replied, "On the authority of Lord God Almighty, have anything that outranks that?" "Mother's" work for the soldiers continues many years after the Civil War ended.

She solicited for disaster aid and regularly helped many complete applications for disability Army pensions. In later years her remarkable tact, executive ability, sound sense, good judgement and thorough integrity were recognized by having thousands of dollars entrusted into her hands for the distribution to many who suffered from the great fire in Michigan and Illinois in 1871. Mother Bickerdyke received her monthly Army pension of \$25 a month twenty-one years after the end of the war. In October 1943, during World War II and 78 years after her Civil War service, a Liberty freighter, the SS Mary A. Bickerdyke was launched. It made 28 trips to the Pacific carrying vital necessities to the fighting soldiers.

On December 2, 2014, a railroad overpass in Galesburg called a "gateway to healthcare" was named the Bickerdyke Bridge. Also in 2014, Representative Don Moffitt put forth a resolution to the Illinois General Assembly to proclaim the second Wednesday of May, annually, to be known as Mother Bickerdyke Day in Illinois. The public is invited to attend to help us celebrate this wonderful woman whose tireless efforts to take care of the soldiers made her one of 300 women who changed the world.
