That after my last article in this newsletter I thought I had answered all the rumors circulating out there regarding VA benefits. To my surprise the calls and e-mails kept coming in from all over the state. I heard from Post 3336 (Peoples Gas) Post 236 (Elvin J. Carrey), 231 (William McKinley) and 687 (Stickney) to name a few. Just goes to show that our Department newsletter is well read by our comrades. I sorted through these recent rumors and have taken five more which I think will interest our members. As for the other Posts, keep them coming and I will publish them at a later date.

- 1. <u>I am receiving compensation at the 100% rate, if I return to work they will reduce my benefits.</u> Partially true. There are two types of 100% ratings; straight ratings and those based on individual unemployability. If you receive a straight 100% rating e.g. severe lung cancer, COPD, diabetes, etc. and you still wish to try work, there would be no reduction. But if your 100% rating is based on the fact that your conditions keep you from working and you return to work, you <u>could</u> be reduced (This can be somewhat technical so if you are in this situation contact our office for advice).
- 2. <u>I have been rated 100% service-connected disabled, I can't get any more VA compensation</u>. This is generally true, 100% is usually the most you can get. But there are exceptions and it falls under a unique benefit called Special Monthly Compensation or SMC. This is a fixed amount added on to your 100% rate based on special medical conditions. For instance, due to a stroke you lost your voice, or the use of your left hand or leg. Or your diabetic and you now suffer from erectile dysfunction. Or you are housebound and need someone to clean and bathe, dress and feed you. These are just some examples and the additional payment can range anywhere from \$136 a month more to over several thousand dollars.
- 3. <u>I am rated service-connected disabled for blindness, obviously I can't get the VA car grant.</u> False. As long as you are blind due to service you do qualify for the special car grant which can be up to \$20,000. You'll just have to have someone else drive the car.
- 4. <u>Veterans returning from Iraq or Afghanistan automatically are being granted 10% service-connection for PTSD and tinni-</u><u>tus.</u> It depends. Although many of our returning warriors do suffer the symptoms of PTSD (Flashbacks, nightmares, anger, sleep issues) and tinnitus (ringing or buzzing in the ears) they sill need to be diagnosed with these conditions. Symptoms are a good leading indicator but medical records showing the actual medical diagnosis are helpful. We encourage all returning veterans from these areas to file their claim and let the VA set up an exam to determine if they qualify.
- 5. <u>I owe the VA money and have to pay it back; I can't list that as a debt if I declare bankruptcy.</u> This is false. Veterans may end up owing the VA money due to many reasons. The most common is a foreclosure on a VA guaranteed loan but debts can be created when veterans fail to timely report changes in their dependents e.g. the spouse dies or their son/daughter drops out of college. Debts also happen when veterans on the need basis pension program return to work and don't report it. The VA computers talk to the IRS computers twice a year and many debts are discovered this way. Although bankruptcy should be a decision of last resort if the veteran decides to go that route they should have their lawyer list the Department of Veterans Affairs as one of their outstanding debts. If the judge okays the motion then the VA must erase this debt.

Hope you found these five rumors enlightening. I will continue to look out for more rumors from our Posts. Keep your calls and e-mails coming and I'll check them out. Legionnaire's Disease Update For Quincy Veterans' Home

QUINCY – The Illinois Department of Veterans' Affairs (IDVA) and the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) are reporting a fourth laboratory-confirmed case of Legionnaires' disease at the Illinois Veterans Home in Quincy (IVHQ). The positive test result was confirmed earlier today. The resident is in stable condition.

Representatives from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) returned to the home in Quincy last week, at the request of IDPH, to provide additional support and guidance. Staff from CDC are working with IVHQ and IDPH staff to:

- Conduct environmental and epidemiological assessments to identify potential exposure sources;
- Augment clinical testing protocols for individuals with respiratory symptoms to include not only testing for *Legionella*, but also influenza and other respiratory viruses;
- Conduct clinical and environmental sample testing at CDC;
- Identify important public health and infection control interventions; and
- Partner in communications with the local hospital to streamline testing.

In addition to infectious disease control and testing protocols, the teams will continue working to trace potential sources of *Legionella* bacteria and conduct additional environmental health testing.

Legionella bacteria occur naturally in the environment. As such, the source is rarely identified in cases of Legionnaires' disease. Approximately 300 cases of Legionnaires' disease are reported across Illinois each year.

The IVHQ completed an extensive renovation of its plumbing systems in response to the 2015 Legionnaires' disease outbreak. Renovations included construction of a water treatment plant capable of providing higher-quality water for the Home's sensitive population. IDVA continues to test and treat its water for harmful bacteria, including *Legionella*. Along with additional chlorine treatments, IVHQ maintains hot water at 150 degrees to prevent the growth of *Legionella*. Hot water is then mixed with cold water to a temperature of 110 degrees, which allows for the maximum control of bacteria while protecting residents from scalding.



His wish was to be buried with his Gifts to Yank blanket that he received many years ago when he was hospitalized. Over the years the blanket fell apart and was thrown out. He gladly gave her a new blanket for her father.

Lincoln's Legacy Remembered at Pilgrimage



America's most popular president was honored Monday during American Legion Post 32's 84th annual national pilgrimage to the tomb of President Abraham Lincoln.

"The annual pilgrimage is now an American Legion Family tradition and one that would please Mr. Lincoln were he to join us today," said Bob Wesley, a Legionnaire from Post 32 in Springfield, III. "Our family is reunited here again today. With pride, we note the national officers of The American Legion, the American Legion Auxiliary and the Sons of The American Legion in attendance to honor Mr. Lincoln and this tradition. Post 32 is humbled that our leaders and members from states

across the nation join us in Springfield to honor our state's favorite son and our nation's greatest president."

National Commander Denise H. Rohan was among those honoring the 16th president on his 209th birthday. "Often underestimated by opponents as a country lawyer, whose political experience consisted only of a single term in the House of Representatives and service in the Illinois legislature, the importance of the Lincoln presidency cannot be overstated," she said after placing a wreath at his tomb. "Freeing the slaves and preserving the Union paved the way for an industrial revolution which would ultimately make America the world's leading superpower."

His legacy also inspired another important movement, according to Rohan.

"One hundred years after Lincoln came another great American, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.," she said. "Dr. King inspired us with a Civil Rights movement and dream that he perfectly annunciated in a most appropriate place, the steps of the Lincoln Memorial."

Pilgrimage organizers believe it is the longest running celebration of Lincoln's birthday in the nation. A number of dignitaries pointed out that Lincoln's support for veterans is a value shared by The American Legion Family.

"As we follow in the steps of Lincoln, we want to make sure that our heroes need to be honored," Auxiliary National President Diane Duscheck said at a luncheon that followed the ceremony at the tomb. "As Legion Family members, we wake up in the morning and gratefully sow seeds, we want to ask what we can do for others and want to let the veterans, the military and their families reap the harvest."

Illinois Gov. Bruce Rauner told the American Legion Family at the luncheon that the day was a celebration. "Today we celebrate the birth of America's greatest president. Today we celebrate the birth of America's most inspirational leader. Today we celebrate the birth of Illinois' favorite son," he said.

While Lincoln promised in his second inaugural address to "care for him who shall have borne the battle and for his widow and his orphan," his life was famously cut short before the vision could be fulfilled. Rohan pointed out that The American Legion began to deliver on the promise more than half a century later.

"It really took another huge war to give us the Lincolnesque vision, this time from the ranks of the military itself, needed to deliver on his ambitious promises," Rohan said. "Men like Theodore Roosevelt Junior, George White, Eric Fisher Wood, Bill Donovan and later, Harry Colmery, would never let America forget its debt to veterans.
