# Did You Know?

That almost all of my articles over the years have dealt with what veterans should do. This month we will take a 180 degree turn and delve into what veterans and their survivors should **NOT** do. There are always two sides to a coin.

If you are sent a flyer stating you can have a free meal if you just will listen to lawyers talk about the Veterans Administration Non-Service Connected pension benefit with aid and attendance be careful. They can't charge you for filing a claim for that benefit but they usually will talk you into setting up various trusts and wills which will cost your money. **DON'T** sign anything unless you know exactly what you are doing. If need be bring a son or daughter along.

If you get a telephone call from someone claiming they are from the Veterans Administration hospital prescription department and they just need to confirm your Social Security number **DON'T** give it to them. That's a big scan to steal your identity.

When you get that call from a person asking for donations to help needy veterans **DON'T** make a contribution over the telephone unless you are 100% sure the group is on the up and up. If concerned, simply ask them to send you a request in the mail. Then when you get that info check them out at one of the many websites like <u>www.givewell.org</u> or <u>www.charitywatch.org</u>.

If you are on the VA non-service connected pension program and someone asks you to collect their winnings for a lotto ticket or gambling casino-**DON'T.** Regardless of their excuse (lost wallet, left driver's license at home, etc.) by collecting the winnings for them, the IRS will be notified under your Social Security number and name. Later when the VA and IRS computers run their cross matches you will end up with a large debt.

If you decide to appeal your Veterans Administration claim and hire a lawyer **DON'T** just accept any fee agreement. The lawyer must get their fees approved by the VA.

If you have forgotten to take your medications and have a lot of pills left over **DON'T** give them to someone who has the same illness e.g. hypertension. Everybody is different and what is a valid dose for you could kill someone else or at the very least make them very sick.

If you're like me and have dozens of passwords for various online accounts **DON'T** use the same password. If a hacker gets your password, they can have a field day with your other accounts.

**DON'T** just notify the VA hospital or clinic when you move. You must also notify the VA benefits side, especially if you have a claim or appeal pending. These two large VA computer systems don't yet talk to each other. So if you don't notify both parts of the VA you may get your medicine and appointment info at the new address but important information on your appeal may be returned by the Post Office as undeliverable.

PS The Post Office will still forward mail for at least six months and perhaps even up to a year.

Safe deposit boxes are nice places to keep important documents but **DON'T** keep your only copy of your military discharge papers in it. Have another copy somewhere at home so that when you pass away your next-of-kin will have access to it. Most bank vaults are not open on weekends, nights and holidays. In most cases the Funeral Home only needs a clear, readable copy, not the original.

Finally if you have been dating several months or having been living with someone for a while **DON'T** add them to your checking or savings account if your VA checks are on direct deposit. If you have a falling out or a lovers tiff that person can clean out your account and you have no recourse with the VA.

That was fun! And I'll leave you with one final tip; **DON'T** forget to read my article in next month's newsletter.

Those who have fought hard for their country and their families know what it is to value special times at home with loved ones. Wishing you lots of joy this Christmas and plenty of happy times with your friends and family.

## 2018 American Legion Legacy Scholarship application now online

The American Legion Legacy Scholarship application for 2018 is now online for new and returning applicants to fill out. The Legacy Scholarship is available for children whose parents lost their lives while honorably serving on active duty on or after 9/11, as well as for children of post-9/11 veterans with a combined VA disability rating of 50 percent or higher.

The renewable scholarship will award up to \$20,000 for the expense of graduate or post-graduate tuition, books, room and board, meal plans, transportation and other supplies needed to achieve a higher education.

#### The application deadline is March 1st.

#### Apply online at <u>www.legion.org/scholarships/legacy</u>.

The Legacy Scholarship is a needs-based one. The grant amount each scholarship recipient will receive will be based on his or her financial need after all federal and state aid is exhausted. Recipients will have a year to use the grant and may reapply to the scholarship up to six times. The number of scholarships awarded and the amount of financial aid granted to each awardee (this includes returning applicants) will be determined on donations to the scholarship fund and one's financial needs.

Scholarship recipients are selected by The American Legion's Committee on Youth Education during the organization's annual Spring Meetings in May. All applicants, whether recipients of the Legacy Scholarship or not, will be notified immediately thereafter.



**WASHINGTON** — Today the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) announced that the application process for the national Veterans Identification Card (VIC) is now available for Veterans — yet another action honoring their service.

This has been mandated through legislation since 2015 to honor Veterans, and today's rollout of the ID card fulfills that overdue promise.

Only those Veterans with honorable service will be able to apply for the ID card, which will provide proof of military service, and may be accepted by retailers in lieu of the standard DD-214 form to obtain promotional discounts and other services where offered to Veterans.

"The new Veterans Identification Card provides a safer and more convenient and efficient way for most Veterans to show proof of service," said VA Secretary Dr. David J. Shulkin. "With the card, Veterans with honorable service to our nation will no longer need to carry around their paper DD-214s to obtain Veteran discounts and other services."

The VIC provides a more portable and secure alternative for those who served the minimum obligated time in service, but did not meet the retirement or medical discharge threshold. Veterans who served in the armed forces, including the reserve components, and who have a discharge of honorable or general (under honorable conditions) can request a VIC.

To request a VIC, Veterans must visit <u>vets.gov</u>, click on "<u>Apply for Printed Veteran ID Card</u>" on the bottom left of the page and sign in or create an account.

Veterans who apply for a card should receive it within 60 days and can check delivery status of their cards at vets.gov. A digital version of the VIC will be available online by mid-December.

# 176th Cyber Protection Team Activates in Bloomington



SPRINGFIELD, IL (11/05/2017) The 176th Cyber Protection Team was honored in a ceremony recognizing the group's official activation at the Illinois National Guard's Armory in Bloomington, Illinois on Nov. 5. Maj. Gen. Richard J. Hayes, the Adjutant General of the Illinois National Guard, presided over the ceremony that included nearly 20 military members, as well as Congressman Darin Lahood and State Representative Dan Brady. During the ceremony, Hayes said this unit was challenged during preparation for activating this unit and would be even more in the future. "This unit comes at a time when they are needed the most," said Hayes. "Cyber Protection becomes more vital all the time and the Illinois National Guard looks to lead the way in battling cyber-attacks." Lahood said cyber security of our national institutions, our businesses and corporations and our personal data continues to be one of the biggest challenges that the federal government faces. "What we are doing here today by activating this unit is we are taking the next step by putting young men and women that are committed to fighting on the cyber security front into action," said Lahood. "I commend Major General Hayes and the Illinois National Guard for stepping up to put this unit in place and we have to continue to be vigilant." Brady said this unit exemplifies what the state of Illinois is trying to do. "We are trying to be pro-active instead of reactive against cyber-attacks," said Brady. The Illinois National Guard works hand-in-hand with multiple state and federal agencies as well as nongovernmental entities in domestic emergency operations and has participated in cyber protection exercises at the state, regional and national level. Partners within Illinois slated to support cyber operations include DuPaul University, Illinois State University, the University of Illinois at Champaign, the University of Illinois at Springfield, Lincoln Land Community College, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Department of Energy's Argonne National Laboratory, the Drug Enforcement Agency, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency, the Illinois State Police, and the DuPage County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management. As part of ongoing growth of cyber forces throughout the Department of Defense, the National Guard announced plans to activate 13 additional cyber units spread throughout 23 states by the end of fiscal year 2019. The current roll out of Guard cyber units is part of laying out a larger foundation for future cyber forces scheduled for activation.

# Doors officially open for new Kankakee-based Army National Guard Facility

The Illinois Army National Guard cut the ribbon and officially opened its new Army Aviation Support Facility (AASF) and readiness center in Kankakee, Illinois, on Nov. 4.

"We are always working to be better prepared for the war fight and domestic response the next time we have to answer the call for duty," said Maj. Gen. Richard Hayes, the Adjutant General of the Illinois National Guard. "This facility moves that training into the 21st century and gives us room to grow in the future."

The \$64.6 million, 185,200-square-foot aviation facility is among the largest projects undertaken by the Illinois National Guard. The building includes an approximately 112,150-squarefoot Army Aviation Support Facility, including maintenance hangers, shops, flight facilities, fuel distribution, state-of-theart fire suppression systems and a cold storage hanger. It also includes an approximately 73,050-square-foot readiness center, including classrooms, offices, ground equipment maintenance, a weapons simulator and flight simulators, vaults and a medical clinic.

Brig. Gen. Mark Jackson, Assistant Adjutant General – Army, Illinois National Guard, who officiated the ceremony, said the project was a true joint effort.

"This project was paid for with funds from the state of Illinois and the federal government," said Jackson. "But we couldn't have completed this project without a strong partnership with the city of Kankakee and the Kankakee Airport Authority." Illinois' Lieutenant Governor, Evelyn Sanguinetti, thanked the Soldiers in attendance for their service and praised the new facility and said projects like this were essential to the economic growth of Illinois before cutting the ceremonial ribbon with Jackson.

"It's our responsibility to provide the best training and facilities

to our Soldiers," said Sanguinetti. "This facility will ensure that we have the best trained and ready Soldiers in the state and in the Army National Guard."

Construction was started in September 2014 and was completed in October 2017. The Illinois Army National Guard will move three units and assets from Chicago Midway Armory to the facility in Kankakee. That includes more than 200 traditional Army National Guard Soldiers, approximately 40 full-time employees and ten UH-60 Blackhawks.

"The functional layout and infrastructure support of this new facility is truly remarkable and it will be a privilege and honor to conduct aviation operations from the Kankakee AASF," said Illinois Army National Guard State Aviation Officer, Lt. Col. Jason Osberg of Champaign, Illinois. "The Kankakee flight facility will allow Illinois Army National Guard aviation to continue our mission more efficiently and enhance our aviation readiness for decades to follow."

Sen. Tammy Duckworth, a former Illinois Army National Guard Blackhawk Pilot with the 106th Aviation, said she was honored to be a part of the ceremony.

"It's an honor to be here at such a great facility for these Soldiers," said Duckworth. "This facility will ensure that the Soldiers here have all they need to defend this nation and serve our people so we don't have to worry about living our lives."

The project was funded with \$52.7 million of federal funding and \$11.9 million of state funding.

"We have had a great relationship with the city of Kankakee." Hayes said. "We look forward to strengthening that relationship along with relationships in neighboring communities like Bradley and Bourbonnais."
