
The American Legion Riders, I cannot say enough about the work they do. Their work within the state and the Legacy Run, keep riding folks.

Finance Committee will continue to look for ways to keep our costs down and we will continue to look at new fundraisers in order to keep our income up.

Our old heating and ac system was installed when the building was built back in the 70's. It had become unreliable and needed replaced. A new system was installed at the cost of \$120,000.00 We would like to thank the Trust Fund Committee for their helping in pay \$100,000.00 of the cost.

Our adjutant Marty Conatser has eliminated some staff positions and reassigned duties. The staff has taken on Auxiliary membership data entry and our print shop has taken on printing for posts and other entities. These are just a couple examples on how Department is trying to maximize income and always watching the expense side. Looking at the proposed

budget for the year 2019-2020 you will see a deficit budget, the vast majority of the deficit is due to the loss of membership. That loss of membership in turn makes fund raisers more challenging with the loss of donors.

For those who order from National Emblem Sales catalog you might have noticed they now have two types of poppies: crepe paper and fabric. The fabric poppies are made in Illinois by Illinois Veterans. Emblem sales began offering the Illinois style poppy a few years ago and demand has increased. We appreciate Nationals support in this endeavor.

As many of you might know we have a new Financial Secretary, Tina Abdelnour. She started with us on August 21, 2018.

I would like to thank all members of the Finance Commission: Casimir Noga, 1st Division Vice Chairman, Ronald Carlson, 2nd Division, Dave Hicks, 3rd Division, Jerry Vogler, 4th Division and William Flanagan 5th Division for all their hard work, Commander Mike Carder and Sr. Vice Commander Roy Weber for attending the finance meetings I would also like to thank Department Commander Mike Carder for allowing the Committee and me to serve. Their support was much appreciated. A special thanks to Marty Conatser, Department Adjutant and the entire staff for their assistance this year.

TRUST FUND COMMITTEE

Hon. Vincent M. Gaughan, Chairman

Purpose of the American Legion of Illinois Trust Fund is to provide an atmosphere of growth and stability to the Trust Fund. This enable and also position the Trust Fund to provide financial assistance to the Department of Illinois and times of financial distress or unforeseen need.

At our American Legion D.E.C. meeting in April, 2019, the Trust Fund transferred \$100,000.00 to the Department for the complete replacement of the Heating and Air Conditioning system at our Department Headquarters in Bloomington, IL. This prevented any diminution any of the American Legion Programs or Services.

It is important to reiterate one of the dark days from when the Department of Illinois was in frightful financial condition. To keep our Headquarters door open we had to borrow about \$500,000.00 from our Trust Fund to operate and function. If our Trust Fund was not properly funded, our Department would have been required to borrow on the open market at the going interest rate. To be candid, we would still be paying interest and principal on our debt of \$500,000.00. This would have

greatly impacted the "Mission" of the American Legion helping veterans and Our Families. Our Trust Fund must always "be ready", willing and able "to support our Department".

In December 2018, our Trust Fund, along with the world market, took a big hit. Because of the correct deployment of our investments, the Fund is 99% restored as of this writing. 


