That all of us have learned something from this lockdown. I would like to take this issue to share some of what I observed.

Too many people are living from paycheck to paycheck. Rainy day savings are rare. Look at all those behind in their mortgage payments or rents. I am old school and my parents taught me to try and have at least six months of savings set aside for emergencies. Of course, everyone has a different set of circumstances but if within your means, do this. Unless absolutely necessary, avoid using your charge cards. I know this is a big order to fill, but check your budget, do you really need cable, when you can get so many tv programs for free. Ask your grandkids, they taught me a thing or two about my smart tv and what is out there.

Appreciate your family and other gatherings next time you get together. Sure, there will be minor arguments over politics or other topics, but at least you are together again with humans. When your Post reopens for meetings, talk to someone you do not know. Even if uncomfortable, remember the months of isolation you just went through and had no one to talk to!

Think about your mortality. COVID has taught most of us that life is fleeting and one day we are here, the next day we could be gone. If your Post has an active chaplain, reach out to them for comfort.

Check your voicemail more often. Friends and relatives, who you seldom hear from, may be trying to reach you and since you may not recognize their number, you did not answer it. Their message may have gone directly there. I cannot count the number of times I tried calling a vet back about his claim and had to leave a message. Three weeks later he gets back to me complaining I never returned his call, only to be told he did not check his voicemail.

Do not be a hoarder but remember the shortages we experienced. Maybe a one-two month supply of canned goods and toilet paper is a good idea.

And finally, there are many non-profit groups that are really hurting. If you have been blessed and can afford it, make some extra donations. My favorites, during this time, have been food pantries, homeless shelters, and the Red Cross, just to name a few.

Sorry I strayed from my normal article content, but I wanted to share some of my thoughts.

There is only one thing more painful than learning from experience and this is **not** learning from experience.

Mission Blue Post Assistance Program



To provide some relief during these challenging times, financial grants are now available for eligible American Legion posts.

Mission Blue Post Assistance Program, will provide \$1,000 grants to posts that are in good standing with their respective department.

These funds must be used exclusively to pay current or past due rent, mortgage, utilities and insurance.

The American Legion National Executive Committee approved Resolution No. 36 Oct. 14, during its annual Fall Meetings. Funds for the approved grants will be provided through The American Legion National Emergency Fund (NEF).

Eligibility for a Mission Blue Post Assistance Program grant requires posts to have:


- 1. A Consolidated Post Report on file.
- 2. Filed an IRS 990 within the prescribed due date.
- 3. Filed all other required forms and reports as prescribed by the department.
- 4. Actively participated in one or more American Legion programs in the last 18 months.
- 5. A financial need.
- 6. A certificate of insurance naming The American Legion doing business as American Legion National Headquarters, 700 N. Pennsylvania St., Indianapolis, IN 46204 as an additional insured.
- 7. Documentation indicating that the post is properly incorporated.
