Week 3 September 12-18: Low-Cost, No-Cost Preparedness

Limit the impacts that disasters have on you and your family. Know the risk of disasters in your area. Learn how to make your home stronger in the face of storms and other common hazards. Check your insurance coverage to make sure it is up-to-date.

Week 4 September 19-25: Teach Youth About Preparedness

Talk to your kids about preparing for emergencies and what to do in case you are separated. Reassure them by providing information about how they can get involved.



Images pouring out of Afghanistan as the Taliban retakes control of the country in the wake of the U.S. withdrawal have veterans of all eras reacting to the unfolding tragedy and wondering how they can assist those in need.

Extracting Afghan interpreters who assisted U.S. troops during the global war on terrorism has been a primary focus of the evacuation efforts. Leaving these individuals behind places their lives in jeopardy as they face death threats from ISIS, the Taliban, al Qaeda and others because of their service to the United States.

Veterans looking to help resettled Afghans with Special Immigrant Visas (SIV) and refugees within their communities are encouraged to reach out to refugee assistance organizations in their local area. Many of these organizations are in desperate need of volunteers and donations. For a list of resettlement agency and affiliate contacts, please visit wrapsnet.org/resources/.

To establish eligibility for a SIV, an Afghan ally must prove that they have at least one year of qualifying employment by, or on the behalf of, the U.S. government. Most SIV applicants are currently in this stage. Veterans and service-members deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom and Freedom Sentinel who are able to help an Afghan ally establish qualifying employment will help expedite the process for them.

Those who served as the direct, senior supervisor or a person familiar with the work of SIV-eligible Afghans on behalf of the United States may submit the letter of recommendation or evaluation. The letter of reference must include the SIV case number to be matched with applicant. The letter should be submitted to SIV-Veterans-Support@State.gov with the subject line of the email being the applicant's name and SIV case number.

A full overview of the program — including the step-by-step instructions on how to navigate this process — <u>is available at this webpage</u>. The Department of State is urging people to follow the instructions closely to help the staff at the National Visa Center work expeditiously. Not all Afghans at risk will qualify for the SIV program. Those who are not potential candidates should be directed to <u>state.gov/afghanistan-inquiries/</u> or <u>travel.state.gov</u> for more information.

"Abandonment of those who assisted us is literally an issue of life or death," American Legion National Commander James W. "Bill" Oxford said in a July statement. "If we abandon such friends, how could we expect any assistance by potential allies in future missions?"

Naperville Post 43 American Legion Riders RED T-shirt Fundraiser: "Remembering Everyone Deployed"



What started as a casual conversation turned into an extremely successful fundraiser for our ALR Post 43, Naperville, IL.

Bill Curran, Assistant Director, Jim Hoch, a friend of the Post and I met after the American Legion meeting on April 4th. Jim said he had an idea for a fundraiser based on his recent purchase of four "RED" T-shirts, using an Amazon gift card from his mother.

Jim asked Bill and I if the Post 43 Riders would consider taking on the project. It sounded like a great idea, where would the proceeds go? We choose the Gold Star Family Memorial Fund, which is currently raising funds for a memorial to be erected in Veterans Park, Naperville. Raising this money would be our way to give to the community with all the proceeds going to this Memorial Fund.

At our next Rider meeting I brought up the fundraising idea. A motion was made to take on the project and seconded, with a unanimous vote of Ayes! Bill and I met with a local company that custom prints T-shirts to work out the graphic design and after a quote we placed our first order and began selling the "RED" T-shirts at the VFW Post on weekends.

Kristen Jungles, with the VFW Auxiliary worked up our flyer/ order form. Nancy Quigley, owner of Quigley's Irish Pub in Naperville, got behind us with her full support and allowed us to sell the shirts Friday nights, June 11 and 18, from 5 – 8pm. We took in over \$1,000 from shirt sales and donations each night. Then Stephanie Penick, Editor and owner of *Positively Naperville*, also gave us her support by publishing where and when we would be selling "RED" T-shirts.

We had full support from American Legion Post 43, Post Commander Nadia Baran and our SAL Squadron making this a fantastic success. On Saturday July 3 we invited all the people who bought shirts to come to the Post for a group photo. I had the honor of presenting a check for \$7,000. to the Gold Star Families Memorial committee.

We weren't done yet - we sold "RED" T-shirts at the Naperville Salute, a weekend event honoring our Veterans and First Responders, another Friday night at Quigley's and then selling shirts at the Naperville Irish Fest raising another \$2,000 that will be presented at the groundbreaking ceremony for the Gold Star Families Memorial September 26th.

Our inspiration and dedication for this Fundraiser comes from a letter we received along with a \$100 donation.

"I am making this donation to honor a dear friend, a Gold Star Mom and formerly an Illinois resident.

Her son John served 4 years with the US Army and reenlisted when he was unable to find a job that would provide support for his wife, stepson, and unborn twin boys. He never got to hold his baby boys, before he got to return home, his helicopter was shot down in Iraq killing him and his fellow crew members. I know the pain has never left her heart.

Bless you all for your work in creating this tribute to the Families that have lost so much."




