Over the last five years, the small 60-member Harvey S. Ruel American Legion Post #1164 has been helping other veterans. Ken Kurtz of Post 1164, also referred to as the St. George American Legion because of the small village they meet in, wanted to raise money to help other veterans living at the Illinois Veterans Home in Manteno, Illinois. When Ken started the fund, he asked his fellow Legionnaires to help him raise money to buy clothing and other items the residents could use. Everyone in the post was glad to help, but Ken always contributed a large chunk of the money himself. That's why the new fund is called the "Ken Kurtz VA Memorial Home Fund."

In this past year, using collections at their meetings and donations from members and friends, the post raised \$2,685.00. \$2,681 of that money was used to buy all these items for the residents of IVHM: 80 assorted T-shirts, 20 pairs of assorted shoes with Velcro, 18 Navy hats, 6 Marine Hats, 12 Army hats, 6 Coast Guard hats, 6 Air Force hats, 10 small sweatpants, 29 large sweatpants, 32 XL sweatpants, 36 quarts of Chicken Noodle soup, 36 quarts of Cream of Chicken Noodle soup, 40 gallons of Hawaiian punch and 800 assorted coffee creamers.

Right before November 11, 2022—Veterans Day—four of the members of the post—1. Mike Spade, the Commander; 2. Larry Blanchette, the Senior Vice Commander; 3. Tim Rehmer, the Adjutant; and 4. Bruce Wood—delivered all of the things they had purchased to the Illinois Veterans Home, and Michelle Shear, the coordinator at IVHM, was there to help them unload and thank them for everything they'd brought. Ken Kurtz wanted to be there, but his health wouldn't allow it. Ken passed away shortly after the donations were delivered to IVHM, but his fund will be continued and will help veterans living at IVHM in the future. Post #1164 will always remember Ken for his generosity and

determination to help others, and they will always remember other veterans who have given so much for our country.





American Legion Department of Illinois, Office of VA&R

The American Legion Department of Illinois has three VA&R Office. Those are located at the Chicago VA&R Regional Office, Marion and Hines. Our offices are located either in or adjacent to A VA Medical Center (Veteran Health Administration - VHA). There are currently 152 VA Medical Centers and approximately 1,400 community-based outpatient clinics in the US.

Nationally, Veterans Benefits Administration (VBA) currently serves nearly 5.2 million Veterans and survivors who receive either compensation or pension benefits. In the past four years alone, VBA has added more than one million Veterans to its compensation rolls, which is more than the active-duty Army, Navy, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard combined. In fiscal year 2018, VBA delivered over \$91 billion in Veterans' compensation and pension benefits.

There is also the National Cemetery Administration (NCA). Twenty percent (105,845 Veterans interred in FY 2020) of U.S. Veterans who died (estimated 592,682 in FY 2020) in the U.S. and Puerto Rico in FY 2020 were buried in a national, state or tribal Veterans cemetery. As new national, state and tribal Veterans cemeteries open, this percentage is expected to increase.

Since 1973, when VA managed 82 national cemeteries, annual interments in VA national cemeteries have increased by more than 348% from 36,422 to 126,884 in FY 2020.

Of the 126,844 interments conducted in FY 2020, 63% were in the 20 busiest national cemeteries: Riverside (CA); Calverton (NY); Florida (FL); Jefferson Barracks (MO); Dallas-Fort Worth (TX); Fort Snelling (MN); Fort Sam Houston (TX) Great Lakes (MI); Abraham Lincoln (IL); Fort Logan (CO); Houston (TX); Miramar/Ft. Rosecrans (CA); National Memorial Cemetery of Arizona (AZ); Sacramento Valley (CA); Willamette (OR); Tahoma (WA); Ohio Western Reserve (OH); South Florida (FL); Massachusetts (MA); and Sarasota (FL).

World War II saw countless heroic acts of bravery, patriotism, faith and commitment! The story of the Four Chaplains is one of the most remarkable exhibitions of those heroic qualities that has ever occurred and witnessed by so many. The combined Normal American Legion Post 635 and Bloomington American Legion Post 56 Honor Guard will hold a ceremony honoring those Four Chaplains and their remarkable acts of brayery and self-sacrifice on Friday, February 3, 2023, at the McLean County Museum of History (the old McLean County Courthouse). The ceremony will be held inside the Museum in the court room and will commence promptly at 11:00 a.m. There will be a speaker followed by an outside three-volley rifle salute, Taps, and a bagpiper to close the ceremony. The personal sacrifices of the Four Chaplains, giving up their lives so that others could live not only was an inspiration to the free world and the effort to win World War II but occurred at a time when inter-religious cooperation and love was not at its best. McLean County has a personal connection to the Four Chaplains, as Reverend George Fox, (one of the Four Chaplains) attended Illinois Wesleyan University and preached in local churches including in Downs. Take a few minutes from your Friday, February 3, 2023, day to learn the in-

VA EXTENDS HEALTHCARE TO VETERANS IN SUICIDAL CRISIS The VA announced that starting January 17, 2023, Veterans in acute suicidal crisis will be able to go to any VA or non-VA facility for emergency health care at no cost. Veterans DO NOT need to be enrolled in the VA healthcare system to use this benefit. This is a tremendous improvement in Veterans' mental health care, especially for the two-thirds of Veterans who have not enrolled in VA health care because of the income means test for eligibility, or because the Veteran did not enroll for other reasons. The new benefit will provide, pay for, or reimburse for treatment of eligible individuals' emergency suicide care, transportation costs and follow-up care at a VA or non-VA facility for up to 30 days of inpatient care and 90 days of outpatient care. This program also will make appropriate referrals for care following the period of emergency suicide care and determine eligibility for other VA services and benefits. Eligibility includes Veterans who were discharged or released from active duty after more than 24 months of active service under conditions other than dishonorable; former members of the armed forces, including reserve service members, who served more than 100 days under a combat exclusion or in support of a contingency operation either directly or by operating an unmanned aerial vehicle from another location who were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable; or former armed forces members who were the victim of a physical assault of a sexual nature, a battery of a sexual nature, or sexual harassment while serving in the armed forces. Availability and access to this mental health benefit is not enough! Veterans, family members and friends of Veterans spread the word and become champions of this program and encourage those Veterans who may be in suicidal crisis to seek the VA for appropriate help. This is the only way that this program can accomplish its
