2023-2024 CAMPAIGN

The Minuteman Campaign is a US Cadet Command initiative to offer Guaranteed Reserve Forces Duty (GRFD) Scholarships to candidates that self-select for service in a Reserve Component.

SCHOLARSHIP OVERVIEW

- The Minuteman campaign awards 2-, 2.5-, 3-, 3.5-, 4-year scholarships.
- Public, Non-resident or private institution rates authorized.
- They must be academically aligned to start and end the scholarship by graduation date and commission.
- Graduate degrees eligible.
- All scholarships are based on available funding.

<u>Veterans Benefits and Resources from</u> <u>Other Federal Agencies :</u>

The American Legion and Bergmann & Moore have entered into a memorandum of understanding for Camp Lejeune issues. The dedicated website –

www.camplejeunelitigationteam.com/al/ – provides a secure online form for Legionnaires and their family members to explain their circumstances. The firm also has a 24-hour phone number – 800-898-9450 – for those who do not wish to use the web platform.

Bergmann & Moore, according to the MOU, "will work in concert with a mass tort law firm as co-counsel to advocate on the claimant's behalf' once eligibility under the CLJA is determined.

The stated purpose of the MOU has four prongs:

- Create, implement and execute a service project for veterans interested in participating in the PACT Act/CLJA litigation

- Protect Legion members and their families through comprehensive education, advocacy and assistance in determining whether a claim under the CLJA would be beneficial to them when compared with filing for and receiving benefits from programs administered by VA
- Ensure Legion members receive the maximum benefits allowed under the law while protecting against predatory and/or unscrupulous actors
- Prevent Legion members from accepting/ receiving a one-time benefit under the CLJA to the detriment of greater, future VA program eligibility and entitlement

Multiple forms of cancer are among no fewer than 15 health conditions or medical events that may have been caused by contamination. Claimants may be veterans, their families, civilian contractors or estates of those who were harmed.

Note: Write you questions down on paper before contacting either a VSO and/or the law firm. Do your research, if possible. This will assist you in preparing your list of concerns. Make notes when speaking to them so that you are not repeating the same question more than once.

NEW VA MISSION STATEMENT

The Department of Veterans Affairs announced an updated version of its 1959 mission statement. The new mission statement reads "To fulfill President Lincoln's promise to care for those who have served in our nation's military and for their families, caregivers, and survivors". The VA currently serves more than 9 million Veterans of which 600,000 are women Veterans, 50,000 Veteran caregivers, and more than 600,000 Veteran survivors. This new mission statement primarily changes references to male Veterans, in Lincoln's original quote to be more inclusive of the current Veteran population and recognizes that survivors, dependents and caregivers now have some access to some VA benefits based on their relationship to the Veteran.
