Veterans Benefits and Resources from Other Federal Agencies:

The below is a brief list of Federal Agency that may be helpful to veterans and their family.

Consumer Financial Protection Bureau: Provides financial education, monitors complaints and coordinates with other Federal and state agencies on military consumer protection measures.

Department of Agriculture: The U.S. Department of Agriculture provides many opportunities to Veterans in the areas of employment, education, and entrepreneurship. In addition to the nations ongoing need for farmers and those interested in agriculture, the USDA affords many Veterans the opportunity to start their own businesses through grants and financing opportunities.

Department of Defense: The Office of Warrior Care Policy supports wounded, ill, and injured Service members recover and reintegrate or transition to civilian life through education and employment initiatives, internships, military adaptive sports, recovery service coordination, and homeless prevention programs.

Department of Education: Service members, Veterans, and their dependents receive guidance and in some cases education benefits, loans, loan forgiveness, grants, and information about college accreditation.

Department of Energy: Provides training programs and partnerships for Veterans interested in working with the Department of Energy or in a career in the energy industry.

Department of Justice: Provides legal information, resources, and enforcement of federal employment, voting rights, and financial related housing laws. Their Elder Justice initiative combats elder abuse, neglect, and financial fraud.

Department of Labor: Provides Service members, Veterans, and their spouses with employment resources and expertise, such as preparing for meaningful careers and with protecting their employment rights.

Federal Communications Commission: The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) provides important information to Veterans to help in protecting their hard-earned benefits. Like many other Americans, Veterans are victimized

by the scourge of Robo Calls and spoofing scams, and the FCC provides ways to avoid being victimized.

Federal Trade Commission: Supports Service members and Veterans with education and resources against unlawful and deceptive practices, scams and imposters, and tracks consumer complaints.

Health and Human Services: The Office of Child Support Enforcement, in the Department of Health and Human Services, provides resources in assisting Veterans and military families with child support issues.

Housing and Urban Development: Coordinates with Federal agencies and organizations that provide Veteran-related housing programs and services including helping homeless Veterans find permanent housing.

Internal Revenue Service: Provides tax information on special credits, deductions, exclusions, and rules, as well as how to manage Federal taxes, to Service members and Veterans.

Office of Personnel Management: Provides Federal employment and retirement information, an employment fair and workshop event calendar, and employment related links and resources.

Small Business Administration: Provides training, mentoring, business preparation, government contracting information, and other small business resources for transitioning Service members and Veterans.

Social Security Administration: The Social Security Administration may expedite the processing of claims for wounded warriors or Veterans who are receiving disability compensation.

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services: The U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) provides information to engage and educate non-US citizen veterans and increase their awareness of naturalization options. If you are a service member or veteran of the U.S. military, you may be eligible to apply for naturalization under special provisions of the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA).

U.S. Postal Inspection Service: The U.S. Postal Inspection Service (USPIS) is the oldest federal law enforcement agency with the mission of protecting and educating Americans, including our nation's veterans from scams specifically targeting them.

Note: Federal Departments may change the narrative of their veteran programs. Ensure when calling that one asks to be connected to right person handling veterans.

VA INCREASES MAXIMUM LIFE INSURANCE BENEFIT

As of March 1, 2023, the VA increased the maximum amount of

life insurance coverage available to Veterans and service members from \$400,000 to \$500,000 for Veterans' Group Life Insurance (VGLI) and Service members Group Life Insurance (SCLI). Veterans under age 60 and currently enrolled in VGLI will be able to purchase additional cover

age in \$25,000 increments up to \$500,000. All active duty, guard, and reserve service members eligible for SGLI will automatically receive the in

creased coverage March 1. VA currently serves nearly 6 million Veterans, service members, and their families with more than \$1.2 trillion of insurance. Life insurance options include SGLI, which eligible service members are automatically signed up for while serving: VGLI which Veterans can transition to from SGLI or apply for within one year and 120 days of leaving the service; VA Life, a new option that provides up to \$40,000 of whole life insurance for Veterans age 80 and under, with service-connected disabilities rate from 0 – 100%. The VA has a total of six different Life Insurance plan options including Family

https://www.va.gov/life-insurance/options-eligibility/ for details of each plan.

VA PTSD TREATMENT DECISION AID

The VA has several different treatment options for Veterans who are suffering symptoms of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). One size does not fit all cases of PTSD and most Veterans are not aware of the options available to them to match their particular needs for treatment and care. To facilitate the selection of the best protocol for treatment, the VA has developed a PTSD Treatment Decision Aid which will provide information about options for the Veteran to learn more about PTSD and how the selection of the right option for treatment can aid the Veteran. The website compares the effective PTSD treatment options and helps answer the questions of What the Veteran wants in a treatment; a treatment comparison chart and helps the Veteran identify their treatment preferences. Coordination with the VA Health Care primary provider and VA Mental Health providers are available to help the Veteran decide what PTSD treatment fits best the needs of the Veteran. We can do this but it will take a lot of work on our part. We know that these renewals are the hardest to get but I believe we can get there by Armed Forces Week: May 15th-21st.


If your post or District needs help, reach out and let us know what we can do to help get you where you need to be.
