As we look to the end of this year and the quickly approaching start of the new card year there will be some new changes which I hope will make us a stronger Department and an easier membership year for all.

The theme for the new year is "Get em early, send them often"

Get em early referring to getting the membership in right out of the box when the posts receive the new cards. I would also encourage you to utilize mylegion.org as much as possible to make the process faster and easier to do. If you need help to get signed up or on there are videos on Legion.org under training to aid with this and the My Legion support number which is 1-833-253-9995.

Every post does something, from donating the post for a celebration of Life or a monetary donation to a school or program all of which is reportable on the Consolidated Post Report. Remember that the CPR is due in to Department by June 1<sup>st</sup>.

Again thank you for a good year and all the hard work done for Membership.

# COMMUNAL MILITARY RITES TO BE PERFORMED AT SPECIAL MEMORIAL DAY EVENT



A special Memorial Day recognition service will be held at Evergreen Cemetery on May 29, 2023 at noon. This service will honor Veterans of all military service and branches and a modified Communal Military Rites will be offered for those families of Veterans from WWII to the present who have NOT had military rites performed. This event will be held at Evergreen Cemetery in Bloomington, IL at the Mausoleum inside the entrance to the cemetery. Starting at noon, a bagpiper will lead a column of flags to the entrance of the Mausoleum. This column will be followed by the Rifle Team and then the Flag Folding Team. The Chaplain will then offer the Invocation at 12:05 (weather permitting), followed by a Flyover and a guest speaker. The Bugler and an Honor Guard member will then conduct a salute and bugle call for each of the branches of service flags. There will be a moment of silence in front of the POW/MIA Flag. Following the service branch salute, the Flag Folding Team will fold the American Flag and make a presentation (s) of the Flag(s) to the families. The names of those Veterans for whom these military rites are performed will be read and the seven-rifle team will fire three volleys (21-gun salute). The Bugler will play Taps and the Bagpiper will perform "Amazing Grace" with the traditional "fading" march away.

Anyone interested in being part of these communal military rites should contact Butch Ekstam at 309-825-2703 no later than May 20, 2023 to register and for more information on what to bring to the ceremony. A limit of 12 families selected on a first come, first serve basis can be honored at this ceremony. The families will need to supply a burial flag and a copy of our honored Veteran's obituary.

The Minuteman Campaign is a US Cadet Command initiative to offer Guaranteed Reserve Forces Duty (GRFD) Scholarships to candidates that self-select for service in a Reserve Component.

#### SCHOLARSHIP OVERVIEW

- The Minuteman campaign awards 2-, 2.5-, 3-, 3.5-. 4-year scholarships.
- Public, Non-resident or private institution rates authorized.
- They must be academically aligned to start and end the scholarship by graduation date and commission.
- Graduate degrees eligible.
- All scholarships are based on available funding.

- Covers full tuition and fees OR room and board (\$10,000 per year)
- Monthly \$420 Cadet stipend (freshmen-senior year)
- Annual \$1,200 book stipend
- Earn E-5 drill pay upon contracting
- Guaranteed commission in the Army Reserve with an eight-year service obligation

Official college/university acceptance letter

Currently Enlisted or eligible to enlist

Must be a U.S. citizen or U.S. National

Meet physical fitness requirements

Between age of 17-28

GRFD MM scholarship recipients cannot compete for active duty

Eligible to participate in the Simultaneous Membership Program (SMP) with an Army Reserve unit
