

On November 9th through November 13<sup>th</sup>, we had our own "Vietnam Wall of Remembrance" on display in our Naperville Park District Grand Pavilion area. All items, including the "Wall" printing; installation and take down; building supplies; etc. were donated by local businesses and individuals. 130+ Veterans volunteered in 4 hours shifts from 6am-10pm daily to assist the public in answering questions, finding names on the "Wall," and sharing their personal stories from serving in Vietnam. In addition, we had special 13 plaques on display to highlight the 11 Men from Naperville that died in Vietnam and all men and women that died due to their service in Vietnam. An estimated 1500-2000 people were in attendance. Below is a brief description of what this wall stands for:

<u>Comradeship.</u> Comradeship in Vietnam is what enabled us to deal with the war itself, personal issues, and our combat missions daily. Comradeship is very special when you're away from home, especially in a war situation, because it's your buddies that enable you to carry through and carry on those missions and the time you must relax between missions. The men that you served with in Vietnam were there to do their job serving their country and protecting their fellow soldiers. We lost a lot of our comrades in combat and the Vietnam Wall of Remembrance enables us to think back and renew our comradeships and yet move on in life because the war is over physically but mentally it still exists in our minds.

<u>Our Memories.</u> Whether it's good or bad, the Vietnam Wall of Remembrance brings back a lot of Memories of Our Service in Vietnam; Our Service to our Country; and Our Service to Our Fellow Veterans. They are the ones that were brought back to the base morgue on their first leg home to their families. This Wall represents over 58,000 men and women who paid the ultimate sacrifice.

<u>Families Left Behind.</u> I know it was their sons and daughters that were lost and it's the families that we cannot forget. This Wall is in large part here to pay homage to their sacrifice and what they went through when they got the official word that their son or daughter was lost in Vietnam. We must always honor our Gold Star Families.

<u>Coming Home.</u> What a special time to be home with family and friends. The Vietnam War never goes away even when back home. Many Veterans have been asked "When were you there?" and they answered, "Last Night!!!" One just never forgets!!!!

<u>Education.</u> We want to educate our youth as to what war really involves and that's why we have our Vietnam Veterans on watch from 6:00 in the morning until 10:00 at night to provide answers to their questions and share experiences of Vietnam and how it affected and



impacted their lives when they got back home. On the other hand, it does represent the sacrifice that our men and women paid during the Vietnam War, losing over 58,000 men and women whose names are on this Wall. Our "Vietnam Wall of Remembrance" is an unbelievable Memorial and Testimony that these 58,000+ Men and Women gave to protect our freedoms and help us all live a good life back here in the United States.

Always Remember those that passed away due to their Service in Vietnam. Agent Orange was a killer that never selected its enemy. It affected many serving on both sides of the War. These Service Men and Women are now also being recognized next to the "Wall" in Washington, DC as part of the "In Memory Of" Program.

Finally, the purpose of having this "Vietnam Wall of Remembrance" here, is that 2023 represents the 50th anniversary of our departure from Vietnam. It is not necessarily a celebration, but a "Remembrance" for all that Served their Country, especially those that Paid the Ultimate Sacrifice.


